Aged 18–30, not in employment, education, or training (NEETs), including early school leavers, young migrants, youth from disadvantaged or remote areas, and young people with fewer opportunities.

Social enterprises, NGOs, and community organizations working with youth.

SEQ-Methodology through Co-design



Identify key skills and needs in social-emotional learning together with young people, social economy actors and stakeholders.

02

Multilingual Gamified Digital Tool



A digital app including short, flexible learning micro-units and SEQ competence cards that help young marginalized people recognise, self-assess and validate their skills in informal and non-formal settings.

03

Local engagement via Living Labs



We improve youth's employability and confidence through Living Labs inspired by the Vienna Weeks model, combining workshops, counselling, peer learning, and direct contact with labour market actors in safe, inclusive local settings.
